Punter's following the Paul Seater stable had plenty to smile about as he again continued his scintillating winning run at Murray Bridge with a double at his home track.

First of his winning double was Awholelotofloving taking out the Nigro Earthmovers Handicap. Settling behind the leaders early in running, Awholelotofloving and took the lead shortly after straightening to hold off the fast finishing Lucenup. Seater has just taken over the training duties of the mare while her owner Jake Stephens looks after his prize charge Alcopop in the rich Sydney Autumn Racing Carnival. Pauls other winner on the day Fine Calibre was all class in defeating its rivals in the MJS Tree & Stump Hcp. Top jockey, Simon Price seemed unfazed at being caught wide for the journey as he unleashed the mare with a powerful burst halfway down the straight to demoralize her opposition at the finish. Paying marginally better than bank interest at \$1.80 race favourite, there is certainly more wins in store for the future. Her win on Wednesday was in a heat of the Provincial Super Series and hopefully we can see her take out the final the \$100,000 Final at Allan Scott Park Morphettville on 2 May.

Jockeys honours went to Justin Potter with a double on the nine race card. His first win was on Richard Croser's Ari's Yacht in the Betfair.com Handicap over 2200m. In a daring ride, Potter stole a brake on his rivals heading down the hill which proved a winning tactic. Ken Knowles mare Countess of Tiba chased gamely to get within a length of the winner and there was a fair amount of real estate between the rest of the field. Potter's other win was in the Carlton Draught Hcp when he persisted with inside runs to beat the Matthew Seyers trained Darakan which was having its 6th preparation from only 11 starts. Having its first start for Seyers the gelding was specked at good odds and will hopefully chalk a win on the board soon for connections.
